<u>Título</u>: Bringing qualified, long-term unemployed youth back into the labor market. Evidence from an ALMP in Madrid

Abstract: Using administrative records of the Spanish Public Employment Services for the period 2018-2020, we evaluate an Market Policy that Labor was implemented October/November 2018 in the Community of Madrid (Spain). The program combines subsidized paid work experience in the public sector with training in cross-cutting skills with a strong focus on employability and job-search assistance. The targeted group were young long-term unemployed individuals and the aim of the program was to enhance participants' opportunities to have a job that matches their education level. Our findings show that the policy has been effective only in the short run. We also show heterogeneous effects across education levels, finding a positive effect for higher vocational education and training (VET) graduates, but not for intermediate VET graduates or university graduates.
